Dear Fellow Deer Farmers

What a ridiculous year it has been. We have seen highs and lows throughout the year but our industry is resilient and will endure. From the worst drought in my farming career to the kindest of winters, this has been a year of contrasts.

This year we are using the services of bidr.co.nz which is an online live auction site this will run in conjunction with the on farm auction. As the Covid alert levels are uncertain, the auction should still be able to go ahead even at Level 3 or less. However, if we get to Level 4 all bets are off!!!

I have thirteen 3yr old stag lots on offer, plus hopefully a small number of velveting stags. The details of the velveting stags will be available on sale day and they will be sold as Lot 14.

A special note should be made for Lot 7 - this is the last ever son of Dam 900 to be offered for public sale. His genetic worth should not be underestimated.

At catalogue stage, many of the three-year olds were still just breaking into their tops. For this reason, the stags have been catalogued in numerical order. A hand-out with the auction order will be made available on sale day if different.

The yearling hind weights are back a little on last year due the drought but I am confident they will all make the 90kg cut-off weight by mating in March. A sale day weight will be available on line and at the auction.

I wish you all well for the holiday season and continued success in your deer farming enterprises.

Sarnia Woburn Story

Sarnia Deer started in 1990 when I purchased my first farm. I have been involved in all aspects of deer farming, including commercial venison and velvet production, trophy production and in latter years a stud operation. I have sat on various committees and been involved in both branch and national activities.

In my first year of farming, to buy a pure Woburn animal was quite difficult and if lucky enough to find one, you would have to extend the mortgage to purchase it. Over the years Woburn deer have become more accessible and now underpin the breeding of many of the best bloodlines in NZ.

In 2012, an opportunity present itself to purchase the Woburn deer at Windermere. At this time Sarnia was producing English Park deer for the market and Woburn deer only contributed in conjunction with Warnham and Furzeland bloodlines. With new and old studs coming and going, the decision was made to develop a pure Woburn bloodline at Sarnia.

The process of changing from a combination of Park lines, to exclusively Woburn, proved challenging. With only a relatively small nucleus to work from, a new sire was purchased from Stanfield, to work as a complete outcross to the existing Windermere line. This sire was of course Pendragon, who brought with him a different style of antler.

Further purchases of hinds were made over the next couple of years, inducing tactical genetics from Stanfield/Woburn and the purchase of either the whole or most of the Woburn herds at Pampas Heights, Canterbury Red Deer Stud and West Bush Deer Stud.

A move to a smaller property enabled a greater reduction in the composite English Park deer and a higher proportion of Woburn Deer to be kept.

For the last few years, investment has been made in the newest semen sires, sourced directly from Woburn Abbey, including Torrington, Henry R, Woburn F40, Ampthill and Thorney. These sires represent cutting edge improvement at Woburn for bodyweights and antler and are a great complement to the Woburn bloodlines already at Sarnia.

As of January 2017, Sarnia Woburn Deer Stud came of age, with only Woburn deer being produced on the property. After nearly 5 years of development, huge investment and some major culling for key production parameters, Sarnia is ready to meet the market as a serious producer of the best Woburn genetics available in New Zealand.

Commercial Velvet line


As velvet stags, pedigrees will not be available but they are all guaranteed pure Woburn, Sarnia bred deer and have made it through both my spiker and two-year old selection.

I believe these animals will go on to produce close to double figure heads by maturity and, being Woburn, all should have the ability to grow out to a worthwhile trophy in later years. Details will be available on sale day and on:


Ampthill @ 3yrs Courtesy of Woburn



A big Torrington son, used in the Woburn farm programme. 235 kg at 3yrs and a beautiful, wide 37 point head antler head. Used at Sarnia as a semen sire. I have been excited to see how his genetics perform here.




Aztec @ 8yrs



A classic in the industry, this sire was bred by Windermere from a full sister to McLeod, Dam 817. Sire Tamar DG set a new world record of 589 6/8 SCI at 6yrs (back before IOA). A big stag, he matured at over 280kg liveweight. Aztec's strength of antler and sheer mass appear to be highly heritable. This combination with the new long round-horn style antler of modern Woburn deer is intended to lengthen velvet and trophy antler whilst keeping the integrity of a thick multi-pointed Woburn head.






A big Drakelow son, 220kg at 2yrs, Bloomsbury matured out to 300kg. His highly heritable weight gain trait has changed the way Woburn deer are often perceived. Velvet production is also no problem for this fantastic stag as he cut an impressive head of velvet plus regrowth totalling over 16kg in just one season. His bloodline is undoubtedly an asset to any serious breeder of English park deer.




Bosworth at 2yrs



This big Bloomsbury son is a new sire at Sarnia. Although I don't have a current liveweight for him, he is a big, framey stag with a head to match. His two year old head had 37 points with plenty of stretch and was 13.6kg at stripping. He had a handful of hinds at two as he arrived very late in the season but had a full complement as a three year old and covered them all. I am extremely excited to see how he develops over the next couple of years to become Sarnia's master sire.




Culloden at 3yrs



This is quite a remarkable Woburn sire. Although not huge in himself, Culloden is leaving behind some amazingly big progeny. For two years running he has led the way in weight gains for his young stock regardless of what line he is mixed with. Velvet wise, he cuts a superbly clean head of SA velvet around the 8kg mark. At 2yrs he grew out to 30 points. His sire being M11 Alexander, this boy creates a good outcross for Woburn bloodlines.





A big bruiser of a stag, this magnificent Bloomsbury son has done himself proud. 235kg liveweight at 3yrs he has left some big progeny behind him. Purchased as a replacement for Pendragon, I unfortunately lost him to an accident this last winter. He has both stags and hinds retained in the Sarnia herd.




F40 Churchill in the Park Courtesy of Woburn




F40 Churchill is straight out of the park and has been used as a semen sire in New Zealand for the last few years. Great antler conformation with round-horn beam and strong tops. Used as a semen sire at Sarnia.






An exceptionally wide antler structure on this young sire. He has mated two seasons at Sarnia now, so his first crop of spikers are under evaluation at the moment but showing promise. Offering a daughter in the yearling hinds this time around. The idea is to use him strategically to increase the spread and top length through the herd. Too early to accurately assess but high hopes given his lineage.






New blood from source, this is an exciting sire. At maturity he weighed in at an impressive 282kg liveweight and had an internal span of 30 inches. The F40 Churchill line is proving very heritable and allows for a valuable outcross to the Woburn lines in New Zealand.





This own-bred stag with beautiful velvet was used once in 2019. His classic velvet head was arguably near perfect and very even. Interesting that the combination between the Haywood line, and the Harvey/Aztec line produced such clean velvet. We unfortunately lost him after the 2019 roar.






Solway has now sired 5 generations of progeny for me. This year marks his second line of 3 yr stags to be offered to the market. His contribution is to thicken the beam and provide multi-point tops. Interesting given his lineage. His first crop of stags made it to nearly 200kg at 2yrs and certainly showing some impressive antler. Solway scored just over 630 IOA (inc. coronets and spread) 2019 at 5yrs.

Used in both the farm and park at Woburn, I have utilized Torrington in my AI programme for several years now. Progeny are all very similar to look at, quiet and grow on well. Yearling hinds offered in this catalogue, sired by Torrington, offer a great opportunity to access new Woburn park genetics ready to mate in 2020. Suitable for both trophy and velvet production, again an important outcross for my herd.




Lot 1 W 17-09 3Yr Woburn Stag







Y 10-63 is a high performing hind at Sarnia, with two of her daughters retained in the breeding herd.




Lot 4 - W 17-18DNA: 2166758**Comments**: This guy is all about the velvet – double bez on







If you know your Woburns this is the pedigree of the sale and one of my personal favourites.




